May is shaping up to be a busy and exciting month at the library. Our first announcement is that starting on May 16th, the Leonia Public Library, along with all of the BCCLS libraries, will be switching to a new eBook and eAudiobook service - CloudLibrary. This means that Overdrive service will end officially on May 15th. We are excited about this new service though, which should offer a better experience and selection of materials.
